#### New Finnish Ambassador to the United States assumes office

[Washington, D.C.] Finland's new ambassador to the United States, Ritva Koukku-Ronde, assumed office Friday after presenting her credentials to President Obama. "I'm excited to be Finland's first female ambassador to the United States," says Mrs. Koukku-Ronde, who comes to Washington after serving in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs for almost three decades.

Ambassador Koukku-Ronde has worked in various positions in the foreign ministry in Helsinki and at Finnish diplomatic missions abroad. Before her posting as ambassador, she served as the Under-Secretary of State at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in Helsinki.

"I am very honored to serve my country in the United States and I am looking forward to promoting our manifold relations, which cover almost all sectors of society," she said.

Although different in size and geographic location, the United States and Finland have many mutual interests, the ambassador noted.

"We share the same values of democracy, human rights, equality and rule of law and have a common vision for the future. We also have an excellent basis for developing our relationship further in the areas of economy, education, security, environment and high technology – to mention just a few," she said.

The ambassador also stressed the importance of co-operation between the United States and Finland in peace-mediation and crisis-management operations around the world. Finland provides military, civilian and development support in many conflict areas, including Afghanistan and Iraq.

"The United States is a crucial and indispensable partner for us, both bilaterally and through the European Union. The EU and the United States both support free trade, democracy and human rights, and in many global issues our interests coincide. Finland is keen to see the transatlantic relationship grow stronger as it will enable us to meet our common goals and utilize our resources in the best possible way."

Arlington, Virginia, USA - 17 September 2011 - Suomikoulu DC, The Finnish School of Washington, DC held its opening ceremony on Saturday, 17 September.

Finnish Ambassador to the United States, Mrs. Ritva Koukku-Ronde and her husband, Dr. Hidde Ronde were the guests of honor at the opening ceremony of Suomikoulu DC, The Finnish School of Washington DC. The school is located in the Resurrection Evangelical Lutheran Church in Arlington VA. Senior Pastor, Rev. Dr. Scott S. Ickert and Administrator Gay Mount also attended the ceremony along with Pastor Tiina Talvitie from New York Finnish Lutheran Congregation, Hanna Wagner from Finn Spark, Inc. and Leila Takala from Finlandia Foundation National Capital Chapter. Also present were school's 40 students, their teachers and parents.

At the opening ceremony, Anuliina Santry, the president of Suomikoulu DC welcomed everyone and introduced the six classes currently held at school: Oravat/Squirrels, Siilit/Hedgehogs, Ilvekset/Bobcats, Ketut/Foxes, Porot/Reindeer and Karhut/Bears. Suomikoulu DC is under the wing of New York Finnish Lutheran Congregation and Pastor Tiina Talvitie offered a blessing for the school. Finnish Ambassador to the United States, Mrs. Ritva Koukku-Ronde stated how wonderful it was to see how many children there are who have motivation in learning Finnish history, Finnish culture and the Finnish language. She also recognized the efforts of all the volunteer workers who put an enormous amount of effort to start the school, pledging embassy support for these kinds of valuable activities. Suomikoulu DC was organized earlier this year with the goal of providing Finnish language instruction to children of Finnish Heritage living in the Washington, DC area. The school is part of the world-wide Suomi-koulu organization, which is working to preserve the Finnish culture and language among young people of Finnish origin. The primary goal of Suomikoulu DC is to teach children to understand and speak Finnish. The school also offers children various experiences related to Finnish culture and fosters a positive attitude in children towards Finnish language and heritage.

The program is hosted by the Resurrection Evangelical Lutheran Church, located at 6201 Washington Blvd, Arlington VA 22205 and is organized under by the NY Finnish Lutheran Congregation. The program also receives support from The Finland Society (Suomi-Seura), Finn Spark, Inc. (Kipinä-Kerho), the Finnish Language School Association, USA and the Finlandia Foundation National Capital Chapter.

### TUCSON TO BE SITE OF THE 2012 FINNFEST USA FESTIVAL

Tucson, Arizona, will be the site of the next FinnFest USA Festival. The festival dates, **November 8-11, 2012**, will permit the festival to

commemorate Martti Ahtisaari Day, an official day now in Finland, a day that Finns use to honor and consider the subject of international peace mediation. For FinnFest USA, International Peace will become the theme of the 2012 FinnFest USA festival. Attendees will see its influence in all elements of program planning.

The FinnFest USA Board of Directors will function as the organizers of the festival. Local residents in the Phoenix and Tucson area will assist as they themselves decide to define their participation. They will be meeting with Ryan Braski, festival chair, in early September. At this point, it can be said that festival attendees will find that America's Southwest will indeed become part of the festival. However, holding the festival in Tucson, while organizing it with leadership living elsewhere, means that the 2012 festival administration will have a different look and feel.

FinnFest USA is now 28 years old, and the original organizing format needs to respond to audience requests for changes in programming and administration. Wanting to stay far away from competition with more traditional "FinnFest" style festivals, the FinnFest USA.
